Best Practice Tips for Growing Grass in Soils with Moss:



- **Apply iron sulphate to all areas with moss.** Once the moss has been 'killed' or 'browned', rake or scarify the soil to remove all the moss but not beforehand, to avoid spreading the spores.

- Aerate the soil (e.g. spiking with a garden fork) and consider putting down feed to enrich the soil.

- Cut back any over-hanging branches to allow more sunlight in and ensure you don't overwater the mossy areas (shade and excessive damp/moisture is often the main cause of moss).

- Ensure you keep the grass height at slightly over an inch, if you have some grass coverage and plan to mow. This enables the grass to retain its strength and less susceptible to scorching.
